

Long-term suppliers declaration for products having preferential origin status¹

The suppliers declaration, the text of which is given below, must be made out in accordance with the footnotes.

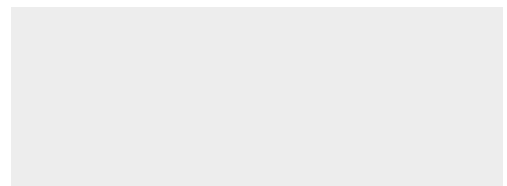

² The supplier's declaration shall bear a handwritten signature of the supplier. However, where both the supplier's declaration and the invoice are drawn up by electronic means, these can be electronically authenticated or the supplier can give the exporter or trader a written undertaking accepting complete responsibility for every supplier's declaration which identifies him as if it had been signed with his handwritten signature.

Take over the text on the first page – after completion – preferably on company letter paper.

- (1) **Description of the goods. (If possible, please mention customs tariff number.) (If you don't have enough space in the writing box, fill in the rest of the information on page 5 of this PDF.)**
- (2) **Commercial designation as used on the invoices, e.g. model No. (If you don't have enough space in the writing box, fill in the rest of the information on page 6 of this PDF.)**
- (3) **Name of the company to which goods are supplied.**

(4) The European Union, country, group of countries or territory from which the goods originate.

For products originating in the European Union, "European Union" must be entered. If abbreviations should be used, please do not use "EC" but "EU" to indicate the European Union. The name of an EU member state (e.g. Germany or France) may optionally be mentioned but then the requirement to obtain preferential origin must be fully met during the production in that single EU member State. In the goods are of preferential origin from a country with which the EU has preferential agreements (e.g. Switzerland, South Africa, etc.), this country must be declared as the country of origin.

Point of attention:

The requirements to obtain preferential origin status are not the same for all contracting countries listed overleaf under (5). Therefore please check carefully which requirements apply and only issue this declaration for those countries for which the goods meet the preferential requirements. If the goods do not originate in the European Union (or an EU Member State) they do not meet the requirements for all countries mentioned but only a part of them. This is complex but very important to fill in correctly. If you have any questions about this, please contact the Chamber of Commerce.

(6) To be completed, where necessary, only for goods having preferential origin status in the context of preferential trade relations with one of the countries with which pan-Euro-Mediterranean cumulation of origin is applicable:

This box is used to indicate whether or not cumulation has been used in order to obtain the preferential origin status of the goods according to the PEM Regional Convention. This means using raw materials from, or doing parts of the production process, in other PEM Regional Convention countries. If so, enter the names of the countries involved, for example: "Cumulation has applied with Turkey and Tunisia". If the goods have obtained the preferential origin status by the production process that has taken place in only one country, fill in: "no cumulation applied".

(7) Give the dates.

The maximum period of validity of a suppliers declaration is 24 months. (A shorter period of validity is also allowed). The day of entry into force must be between 12 months before and 6 months after the date on which the declaration is issued.
